CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Murray called the workshop to order at 5:30 pm and welcomed those present.

II. Discussion & Review

A. Legislative:

Town Manager Willis told Council there was a substantial increase in the proposed legislative budget due to funds designated to the storefront restoration project proposed by the Redevelopment Commission. He said the town would set aside \$25,000 in an attempt to encourage business owners to improve the aesthetics of the outside of their buildings. Mr. Willis said the commission was still working out the details of the program but said possibilities included grant awards, matching fund grants, etc. Town Manager Willis said the newly created Parks and Recreation Commission was looking at town parks and the Sands and was considering signage and security cameras and playground equipment for the Naval heritage Park. He explained TIF funds are available to purchase the equipment for the park. Mr. Willis said they were working with some local churches to help with improvements at the park. He said this budget also included a 2% cost-of-living increase plus FICA and retirement increases for employees in this department.

B. Executive:

Town Manager Willis told Council the executive budget also included a substantial increase due to operation of the Shrimp Dock. He said he expected next year's cost for the dock to be about \$500,000. Mr. Willis said special contracts which include legal cost and the Burton Fire District were down a little.

Town Manager Willis explained anticipated revenues of \$5,652,903 for the year was based on 71 mils of which \$2,200,003 was estimated property taxes. He told Council this budget addresses the termination of the BJWSA note for sale of the water department.

Councilmember Klein said he would like to see the millage rate moved to 72 mils in order to have a cushion to fall back on for unexpected maintenance of roads, the wetlands, boardwalk, etc.

Town Manager Willis said the increase from 71 to 72 mils would calculate into approximately \$27 more in taxes for property owners.

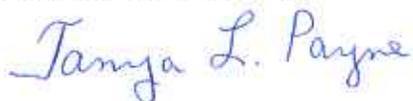
Councilmember Heyward agreed with Councilmember Klein and said that taxes needed to be gradually increased to meet the needs of the town's citizens.

Town Manager Willis said he could adjust the budget to reflect 72 mils but said the actual rate would not be decided until August.

There being no further comment, the workshop adjourned at 5:55 pm.

I. CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Murray called the Public Hearing to order at 6:30 pm.

II. PURPOSE:

- A. Ordinance 2015-9. An ordinance rescinding Ordinance 2006-34 and Ordinance 2009-6 pertaining to fee schedules for building permits and other various fees as necessary for ease in operation and services of the Town of Port Royal. The aforementioned ordinances shall be replaced by 2015-9.**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-9 by title and explained this ordinance was to revisit permit fees. He explained the current fees did not cover the cost of services provided by the town and said these changes would help recoup for those services.

- B. Ordinance 2015-10. An ordinance amending Article II., Section 20-30, Replacement of trees of the code of ordinances of the Town of Port Royal, South Carolina**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-10 by title and explained this ordinance was an attempt to update the mitigation program for tree removal in the town. He said the fees in this ordinance would be a burden on developers and residential owners and suggested the ordinance be tabled until further study could be done.

Greg Baisch expressed concerns about the proposed fees saying it might deter developers from working in the town. He said there were other effective ways in which to mitigate a tree fund.

- C. Ordinance 2015-11. An ordinance annexing to the Town of Port Royal approximately 4.04 acres of real estate located in Beaufort County described as Beaufort County Tax District 100, Map 28, Parcel 120B (located on Robert Smalls Parkway near Prosperity Lane in Beaufort County South Carolina)**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-11 by title and showed the property on the map. He covered the requested zoning for the property as stated in Ordinance 2015-12 and said the Metro Planning Commission had unanimously recommended both the annexation and zoning. Mr. Willis told Council the property is located within the town's growth area and the zoning is consistent with the future land use map. He explained the zoning is consistent with adjoining properties along Robert Smalls Parkway.

- D. Ordinance 2015-12. An ordinance to zone approximately 4.04 acres of real estate located in Beaufort County described as Beaufort County Tax District 112 (formerly Beaufort County Tax District 100), Map 28, Parcel 120B in Beaufort County South Carolina to be zoned as T4 Neighborhood Center Open (T4NCO)**
- E. Ordinance 2015-13. An ordinance annexing to the Town of Port Royal approximately .95 acres of real estate located in Beaufort County described as Beaufort County Tax District 100, Map 28, Parcel 200 (located on 590 Robert Smalls Parkway in Beaufort County South Carolina)**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-13 by title and reviewed the zoning request for the property. He showed the property on the map and said the Metro Planning Commission had unanimously recommended the annexation and zoning. Mr. Willis said the property is in compliance with the future land use map.

- F. Ordinance 2015-14. An ordinance to zone approximately .95 acres of real estate located in Beaufort County described as Beaufort County Tax District 112 (formerly Beaufort County**

Tax District 100), Map 28, Parcel 202 in Beaufort County South Carolina to be zoned as T4 Neighborhood Center- open (T4NC-O)

- G. Ordinance 2015-15. An ordinance to amend as follows Section I of Ordinance 2014-6 to provide for the levy of taxes for ordinary town purposes in the Town of Port Royal, South Carolina, for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2015, and to provide for the expenditures thereof.**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-15 by title and said this ordinance would set the budget for the new fiscal year. He explained the total budget of \$5,686,903 included an increase for operation of the Shrimp Dock. Mr. Willis said this included \$2,268,003 in estimated property taxes with a millage rate at 72 mils. Mr. Willis said the anticipated millage increase has been designated for capital reserves.

There were no comments.

Staff Present: Town Manager Van Willis, Planning Administrator Linda Bridges, Police Chief Alan Beach and Municipal Clerk Tanya Payne

I. CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Murray called the workshop to order at 6:47 pm and welcomed those present.

II. COUNCIL BRIEFING:

Town Manager Willis told Council the number of low to moderate income families in the town has below the fifty percentile mark making it easier for the town to qualify for CDBG grants. He said some programs available through grants were neighborhood revitalization, main street revitalization and a special projects fund which includes historic preservation. Mr. Willis explained there were two funding cycles for the grants and said he would ask LOCOG to do a Needs Assessment for the spring cycle. Mr. Willis said permitting for work at the Fort Frederick boat landing was under way, the County and DNR are working on improvements at the landing and that Fort Frederick must be protected. He told Council the Parks and Recreation Commission had met at the Sands to discuss improvements to include security cameras for that area. He said they were also looking at the park fees and a facility rental application. Mr. Willis said town staff and the Parks and Recreation commission was working on a contract and fees for the Shed. He said two proposals had been received for the port sale and explained a contract must be signed by the end of the month to meet requirements of the port law. Mr. Willis said the stormwater rate study was still on going, Dr. Plaag was putting together a scope for presentation for an historic district, and a lawsuit has been filed against the Spanish Moss trail by adjacent property owners who had not been

given the opportunity to purchase property adjacent to their property. Mr. Willis told Council work was underway to repair the observation tower and said it would be completed by July 4th.

Councilmember Klein discussed problems with boat parking at the Sands saying parking signs would be helpful. He also asked about signs to route bicyclist to the Sands until the trail can be completed.

III. REVIEW AGENDA FOR THE June 10, 2015 COUNCIL MEETING:

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-9 by title and explained this was an update to the fees schedule which would allow the town to cover the cost of services provided. He said Sections 13 and 14 were removed from the ordinance.

Town Manager Willis explained that after discussion in the preceding Public Hearing, Ordinance 2015-10 would be tabled to all for more research on the issue.

Town Manager Willis read Ordinances 2015-11 and 2015-12 to annex and zone approximately 4.04 acres located on Robert Smalls Parkway. He said the Metro Planning Commission had recommended adoption of both ordinances.

Town Manager Willis read by title Ordinances 2015-13 and 2015-14 to annex and zone approximately .95 acres on Robert Smalls Parkway. He explained this property was located across the road from the previously discussed request and said the zoning would be the same. Mr. Willis said the Metro Planning Commission had recommended both annexation and zoning for the property which is located in the town's growth boundary and complies with the future land use map.

Town Manager Willis read ordinance 2015-15 by title and explained it would set the budget for the upcoming fiscal year. He said the budget totaled \$5,686,903 with an anticipated millage rate of 71 or 72 depending on what final collections were. Mr. Willis said the additional millage is designated to reserves or current capital projects to include the Shrimp dock. He further said the budget includes a 2% cost-of-living increase for employees and a dump truck for public works.

Town Manager Willis reviewed first reading Ordinance 2015-16 to add 902 7th Street to the Port Royal Historic Landmark District. He said the Historic Preservation Commission had reviewed and recommended this request.

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-17 by title and said the Metro Planning Commission had unanimously recommended the annexation. Planning Administrator Bridges told Council the Metro Planning Commission had recommended T3N for the larger area of the property and T4NC for the smaller parcel. She said this zoning is more appropriate considering the zoning of adjacent properties. Mr. Willis showed the property on the map in relation to neighboring properties already located in the town.

Attorney Kevin Dukes explained the intent for this property was to have a suburban neighborhood on it and explained the T4NC zoning was not needed. He explained the T4NC zoning included higher density and some commercial development which was not in the plans.

Town Manager Willis reminded Council members were needed for the Design Review Board, the Zoning Board of Adjustments and Appeals, the Municipal Election Commission, the Parks and Recreation Commission and Capital Sales Tax Commission.

Town Manager Willis discussed Capital Sales Tax and suggested the town pass a resolution in support of the Local Option Sales Tax over the Capital Sales Tax. Council requested that a LOST resolution be placed on the agenda for next week's meeting.

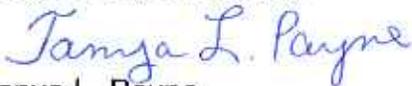

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

III. COUNCIL BRIEFING:

Town Manager Willis told Council the real estate agent, the Port's Authority and the port buyers had met and said he was waiting for a report on progress of the sale.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

At this time, the Mayor will recognize members of the audience who have submitted speaker forms to address the Council on agenda items. Each speaker will be limited to two minutes

Jim Crower, Metro Planning Commission member spoke concerning Ordinance 2015-18 to zone property on Castle Rock Road. He pointed out the area of the proposed annexation and zoning on the map and explained the small parcel is in the center of a high activity area while the other parcels are located in a less dense area. Mr. Crower said the planning commission had recommended that the smaller parcel be zoned for more density.

VI. SECOND READING:

- A. Ordinance 2015-9. An ordinance rescinding Ordinance 2006-34 and Ordinance 2009-6 pertaining to fee schedules for building permits and other various fees as necessary for ease in operation and services of the Town of Port Royal. The aforementioned ordinances shall be replaced by 2015-9.**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-9 by title and explained this ordinance would update the fee schedule relative to costs the town incurs for services. He said the fees are based on the International Building Code. Mr. Willis said Sections 13 and 14 had been deleted.

Councilmember Lee moved to adopt Ordinance 2015-9 and Councilmember Heyward seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

- B. Ordinance 2015-11. An ordinance annexing to the Town of Port Royal approximately 4.04 acres of real estate located in Beaufort County described as Beaufort County Tax District 100, Map 28, Parcel 120B (located on Robert Smalls Parkway near Prosperity Lane in Beaufort County South Carolina)**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-11 by title and showed the property on the map. He reviewed the zoning request of T4NC-O for the property and said both the annexation and zoning were unanimously recommended by the Metro Planning Commission. Mr. Willis said the annexation complies with the town's future growth boundary and the zoning complies with the future land use map.

Councilmember Lee moved to adopt Ordinance 2015-11 and Councilmember Heyward seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

- C. Ordinance 2015-12. An ordinance to zone approximately 4.04 acres of real estate located in Beaufort County described as Beaufort County Tax District 112 (formerly Beaufort County Tax District 100), Map 28, Parcel 120B in Beaufort County South Carolina to be zoned as T4 Neighborhood Center Open (T4NCO)**

Councilmember Lee moved to adopt Ordinance 2015-12 and Councilmember Klein seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-13 by title and showed the property on the map. He explained the zoning request for the property is T4NC-O and said the Metro planning commission had unanimously recommended both the annexation and zoning. Mr. Willis said the annexation and zoning are in compliance with the town's growth boundary and future land use map.

Councilmember Heyward moved to adopt Ordinance 2015-13 and Councilmember Klein seconded the motion.

Councilmember Klein moved to adopt Ordinance 2015-14 and Councilmember Heyward seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

- F. Ordinance 2015-15. An ordinance to amend as follows Section I of Ordinance 2014-6 to provide for the levy of taxes for ordinary town purposes in the Town of Port Royal, South Carolina, for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2015, and to provide for the expenditures thereof.**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-15 by title and said this budget included a 2% cost-of-living increase for employees, a Store Front Improvement Project, twenty-five thousand dollars for park improvements and allows tax funds to be set aside in a savings account for large capital projects such as roads. He said the proposed budget totaled \$5,686,903.

Councilmember Lee moved to adopt Ordinance 2015-15 and Councilmember Klein seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

VII. FIRST READINGS:

- A. Ordinance 2015-16. An ordinance adding 902 7th Street to the list of properties in the Town of Port Royal Historic Landmark District**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-16 by title and explained the previous owners of this property located at the corner of 7th Street and London Avenue did not wish to be on the Historic Landmark List but said the new owners were requesting to be added. He said the Historic Preservation Commission had unanimously recommended the addition to the list.

Property owner, Mr. Phil Lafountain told Council he and his wife along with Architect Cooter Ramsey planned to bring the house back to its original glory. He said the outside of the house would be basically the same and they would try to keep inside original as much as possible.

Councilmember Lee moved to adopt first reading of Ordinance 2015-16 and Councilmember Heyward seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

- B. Ordinance 2015-17. An ordinance annexing to the Town of Port Royal approximately 30.32 acres of real estate located in Beaufort County described as Beaufort County Tax District 100, Map 28, Parcels 118 and 120 and Beaufort County Tax District 100, Map 31, Parcels 3 and 1047 (these unaddressed parcels are located between Robert Smalls Parkway and Anderson Lane and on Castle Rock Road in Beaufort County South Carolina)**

Town Manager Willis read Ordinance 2015-17 by title and said the Metro Planning Commission had recommended the annexation of the property. He reviewed the zoning for the property and explained the Planning Commission had recommended T3 for the majority of the property but had recommended T4NC for the smaller parcel. Mr. Willis said the owners were still requesting T3 zoning for the entire property.

Kevin Dukes, representing the owners said they are fine with T4 for the smaller parcel.

Councilmember Heyward moved to adopt first reading of Ordinance 2015-17 and Councilmember Lee seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

- C. Ordinance 2015-18. An ordinance to zone approximately 30.32 acres of real estate located in Beaufort county described as Beaufort County Tax District 112 (formerly Beaufort County Tax District 100), Map 28, Parcels 118 and 120 and Beaufort County Tax District 112, (formerly Beaufort County Tax District 110), Map 31, Parcels 3 and 1047 in Beaufort County South Carolina to be zoned as T3 Neighborhood (T3N)**

Councilmember Lee moved to adopt first reading of Ordinance 2015-18 with the distinction of T3N for Parcels 118, 120 and 3 with Parcel 1047 being zoned as T4NC. Councilmember Klein seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

VIII. RESOLUTION:

A. Resolution 8-2015. A resolution in support of the Local Option Sales Tax

Town Manager Willis read Resolution 8-2015 by title and explained it would show Council's support of a Local Option Sales Tax over a Capital Projects Tax.

Councilmember Heyward moved to adopt Resolution 8-2015 and Councilmember Klein seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

IX. COUNCIL'S ACTION:

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

Councilmember Klein moved to appoint Mary Seamon to the Municipal Election Commission and Councilmember Lee seconded the motion.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

4. Parks and Recreation Commission – appoint one

There was no appointment to this commission.

5. Capital Sales Tax Commission – recommend one

Councilmember Klein moved to recommended Dean Moss for the Capital Sales Tax Commission and Councilmember Heyward seconded the motion.

Mayor Murray and Councilmembers DeLoach, Heyward and Klein voted yes.
